

Doing the work... better.

In 2025, AIOF took a hard look at what wasn't working with traditional cancer screening events—and the answer was clear: location mattered. Rather than asking individuals to travel to a lab or imaging suite, we made a deliberate shift to bring cancer screenings to the people. By meeting our community where they already gather, we transformed screenings into accessible, welcoming, and even fun experiences—hosting events at two unique venues: the Alaska State Fair and Kenai River Brewing.



The inaugural AIOF Cancer Screening Day at the Alaska State Fair was an overwhelming success. A total of 128 individuals received cancer screenings, and the event generated 2,424 engagements through the participation of 16 community partners—marking the first event of its kind at the Fair. While coordinating a first-year event of this scale required significant planning and logistics, fairgoers were enthusiastic and grateful for the opportunity to have vital health screenings brought directly to them.

Screening in Soldotna

Building on that momentum, AIOF partnered with Kenai River Brewing, Alaska Men's Run, and Central Peninsula Hospital to host the first annual "Beer for My Boys" prostate cancer screening event. In just two hours, 88 men were screened through a simple blood draw for PSA testing. To celebrate participation and keep the atmosphere approachable, each man screened received a coupon for a free beer—helping break down barriers and start important conversations around men's health.
